

Cabin Counsellor

All staff should enjoy working with children and youth ages 6–15. Staffs are enthusiastic and excited facilitators of a safe and fun summer camp for all participants. Cabin Counsellors must:

- Supervise a cabin group of 6–8 campers
- Be familiar with any health concerns and medication needs of their campers
- Be sensitive to the emotional and physical welfare of campers
- Accompany campers to activities and ensure that campers are punctual for all activities
- Be enthusiastic participants in all camp activities -- leading by example
- Must be familiar with camp emergency procedures, and will respect and comply with all camp policies and procedures.
- Tasks may include, but are not limited to:
 - welcoming campers
 - camp orientation for campers
 - daily chore assignments
 - assisting Program Counsellors with the implementation of programs
 - serving meals
 - assisting in planning campfire entertainment
 - cleaning cabins

All camp staff and campers remain on site during camp, unless permission to leave is granted by the Camp Director. All leadership team members are available to help each other as needed. Cabin Counsellors are directly responsible to the Camp Director. This position is deemed to be a level 2 risk assessment with a high level of responsibility and authority for the safety and well-being of campers.
