

Program Counsellor

Program Counsellors are responsible for planning and implementing camp activities for small groups of campers and also camp wide games for all campers. In consultation with the Program Coordinator, Program Counsellors will provide a wide range of activities including physical activities, crafts, community building games etc. Program Counsellors are also responsible for:

- Taking into consideration health concerns and physical limitations of campers in their provision of a balanced and safe program
- Being punctual in their provision of activities
- Showing enthusiasm participation in all camp activities -- leading campers by example
- Tasks may include, but are not limited to:
 - taking part in the registration process for each camp
 - welcoming campers
 - camp orientation for campers
 - daily chore assignments
 - assisting Cabin Counsellors with campers as needed
 - serving meals
 - assisting in planning campfire entertainment
 - cleaning cabins
